

Arlington's Department of Environmental Services staff continues to work collaboratively with the development community to assess the timing and impacts of private development and Arlington's own capital projects on the public right-of-way in Pentagon City, Crystal City and Potomac Yard. To date, we estimate that there is over \$1.5 billion in privately funded development and over \$250 million of public funded transportation projects that are either currently under construction or expected to break ground within the next 24 months. This unprecedented level and concentration of construction activity will affect most of the street network in this part of Arlington. All aspects of the public right-of-way from streets and sidewalks, parking/meters, regulatory signs, street lights, signals and below-grade utilities will be impacted. Given these conditions, the temporary pause in the acceptance and processing of small wireless attachment applications for County-owned streetlight poles in the above-referenced area will be extended to July 1, 2021. As such, no applications for County-owned light poles in this area will be processed during this extended period. A web GIS link is provided to illustrate the area being referenced. We will continue to evaluate the boundaries of this hold area and some revisions to the boundary are expected on or before the July 1 date.
